Students who have not achieved the GPA requirement of 2.50 or higher after Probation I and II will be dismissed from teacher education and encouraged to change to a nonteaching major in the College of Education or to a major in another college within the University that does not require an overall GPA of 2.50. Students who have been dismissed from teacher education and who later improve their overall GPAs to 2.50 may apply for re-enrollment or re-admission to teacher education if they wish to do so. However, they are not guaranteed acceptance. Their applications must be approved by their advisors, department head, and dean (Undergraduate Handbook, p. 14).
